The Quinte Museum of Natural History (QMNH) proudly presents **Expedition Alert: Stories from the High Arctic**, launching this winter.

This immersive experience brings the northernmost permanently inhabited place on Earth – Alert, Nunavut – to our community, sharing the extraordinary biodiversity of the Polar Desert and the urgent stories of a region experiencing the frontlines of climate change.

At its heart, Expedition Alert showcases the fieldwork of emerging researchers from the Université du Québec à Rimouski (UQAR), who journey to this remote outpost to study its fragile ecosystems and contribute to our understanding of the Arctic's role in sustaining life on Earth.

Guided by the principle of Two-Eyed Seeing, the exhibit interweaves these scientific stories with Indigenous knowledge, offering visitors a fuller, more balanced understanding of the Arctic and the lessons it holds for our shared future.

But this is more than an exhibit. It is an **invitation to relationship** – to learn from the land, to honour the wisdom of knowledge keepers and to reflect on our shared responsibility to care for the planet.

Together, with your partnership, Expedition Alert can inspire action, foster understanding, and create a space where science, culture, and community come together.


